



What SB1 means to the Consultant Community in District 7?

The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017



SB 1 Programs (statewide)

- **SHOPP** State Highway Operations Protection Program
- **HM** Highway Maintenance
 - \$1.8 billion/year for SHOPP & HM
- ATP Active Transportation Program \$100 million/year
- LPP (formulaic & competitive) Local Partnership Program
 - \$200 million/year
- TCEP Trade Corridor Enhancement Program \$300 million /year
- SCCP Solutions for Congested Corridors Program \$250 million/yr
- **STIP** State Transportation Improvement Program
- TIRCP Transit, Intercity Rail Capital Program





SB 1 Programs – D7

SHOPP – 29 projects, \$1.28 billion

HM – 28 projects, \$113.8 million

* The next 7 years

** Statewide: Total SHOPP & HM programs = \$9.45 billion D7 has 14.7% of SHOPP & HM total by \$\$

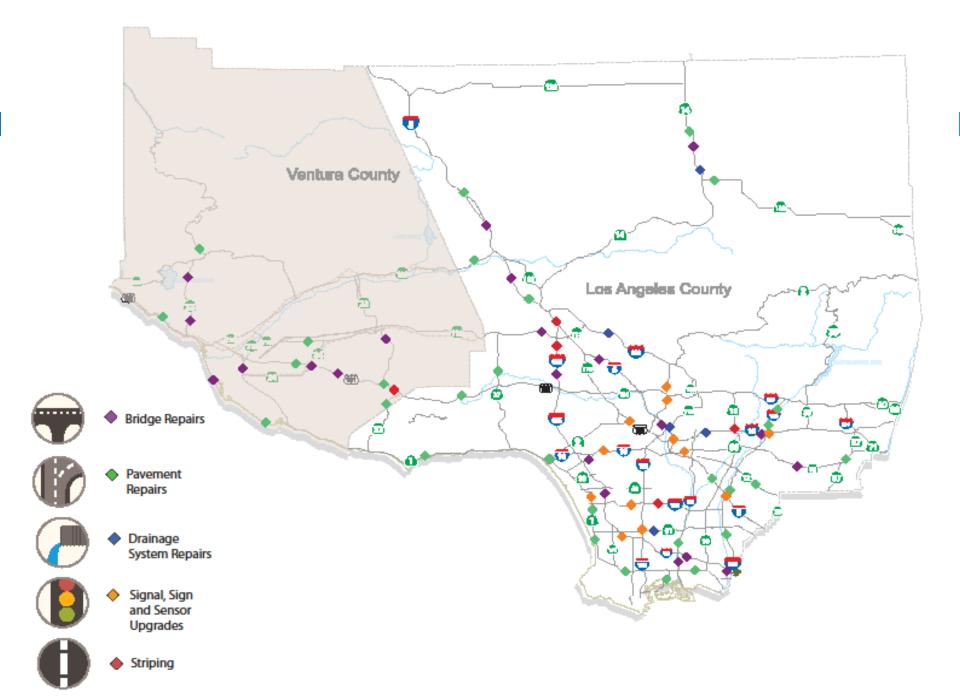

ATP – Identifying projects for 2020 cycle 5.

LPP – 4 projects:

- \$375.2 million total project
- \$95.9 million SB1

TCEP – 5 projects (on system):

- \$1.24 billion total project
- \$398.6 million SB1
- SCCP 1 project (off system), 96th St. Transit station
 - \$525.2 million total project
 - \$ 150 million SB1

Challenges

- Safety: Increased number of projects due to SB1, increased exposure to workers and public during construction.
- Teaming up and staffing up: Companies competing for the same people, experience and competing with Public Agencies.
- Coordination of projects within and outside of Caltrans.
- 2028 Olympics

- Consultants are important to Caltrans' project delivery.
- Consultants will be needed to help Caltrans meet or exceed the Accountability and Transparency requirements of SB1.
 - Fix it first/asset management
 - Efficiencies (VA, VECPs....)
 - Scope, Budget and schedule
